

VIRGINIA STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (VSMP) PERMIT GUIDE

The following items are suggested prior to starting a design for projects 1 acre or greater:

- Review the City of Danville code requirements for VSMP permits.
- Review the VSMP Construction General Permit.
- Review the reference material relating to Technical Criteria Part II B of the Virginia Stormwater Management Regulations. (Starting at Virginia Administrative Code section 9VAC25-870-62)

The following items are required for a VSMP Permit Review:

- Submit the ESC / SWM / VSMP Project Information Worksheet.
- Submit all applicable water quality and quantity design documentation including the Virginia Runoff Reduction Method Worksheet used for design.
- Submit all temporary erosion and sediment control calculations and all permanent stormwater BMP design calculations for review.

Prior to issuing a VSMP Permit, the following items are required:

- The erosion and sediment control plan must be approved.
- The stormwater management plan must be approved.
- A Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan must be approved.
- The owner must execute a Stormwater Facility Maintenance Agreement for any and all permanent stormwater BMPs to control runoff quality and quantity.
- The owner may request the use of offsite nutrient credits to meet water quality regulations. Nutrient credits must be purchased prior to issuance of the permit.
- The VSMP Registration Statement must be completed and submitted.
- The VSMP permit fee must be paid.
- The City of Danville's Land Disturbance Permit must be issued.

Prior to terminating the VSMP Permit, the following conditions must be met:

- All disturbed areas must be permanently stabilized.
- All temporary controls must be removed and disposed of properly.
- All permanent stormwater BMPs must be installed, functioning and certified by the designing engineer and as-built drawings must be submitted to this office for review and approval.
- Any outstanding VSMP Permit violations or SWPPP violations must be resolved.
