



Violent Crime and Burglary Trend 2017, 2018, 2019 Comparison



Year-to-Year Comparison

Offense	2018	2019	% Difference
Burglary	225	182	-19%
Aggravated Assault (all weapons)	122	68	-44%
Aggravated. Assault (firearm only)	91	37	-59%
Forcible Sex Offenses	45	25	-44%
Robbery	60	22	-62%
Murder	11	8	-27%

2019 Danville Police Department Case Clearance Compared to National Clearance Rate 2018 (FBI-Crime in the U.S.)

Murder	75.0%	62.3%	+12.7%
Rape	60.0%	33.4%	+26.6%
Robbery	69.6%	30.4%	+39.2%
Aggravated Assault	64.7%	52.5%	+12.2%
Burglary	28.7%	13.9%	+14.8%

Department Strategies

- Features leading to current crime reduction successes
 - Accountability
 - Daily, weekly, and monthly accountability meetings (significant incident review)
 - Geographic areas of responsibility (Area Commanders)
 - Problem-based strategies
 - Identifying and addressing repeat calls for service and crime patterns
 - Offender-based strategies
 - Predictive analysis and preventative responses (focus on violent/gang offenders)
 - Data driven approach to identifying violent/repeat offenders
