


A QUICK THOUGHT FROM THE DESK OF THE DIRECTOR

I eventually settled on *The Unforgettable Logan Foster* by Shawn Peters, a recommended book for middle grade readers. 
FIND SOMETHING NEW TO READ

My Darkest Prayer was recently rereleased in paperback, and two of his other books, Blacktop Wasteland and Razorblade Tears are ones that I most frequently recommend. You'll want to read some sentences aloud to be able to fully savor them, and laugh at the character's wit and ingenuity.

The Folk of the Air series by Holly Black became an instant favorite for me in 2022. I could not put these books down! Jude and Cardan's story swept me away in this first of the trilogy, The Cruel Prince.

A human surrounded by immortals in the Court of Faerie, Jude has to work twice as hard to find her place among the creatures that stole her and her twin sister from their home.

Prince Cardan is cruel as he is handsome, and his hate and wickedness burn the brightest for Jude. Because fate is cruel, the two enemies will have to form a twisted alliance in order to save the corrupted and crumbling Faerie. This enemies-to-lovers trilogy will whisk you away to somewhere magical.

Holds can be placed over the phone by calling **434.799.5195** or **online** through our catalog!

Simply visit **readdanvilleva.org** and click on **My Account**.

Once prompted type in your **library card number and pin** (this should be the last four digits of your card number).

Use the search bar to browse our catalog and select your item.

Click the **orange place hold** button and then **submit hold**.

A staff member will grab the item and have it ready when you arrive!

Holds are kept at the Adult Service Desk on the **first floor** for three business days.
