

Get to know Ruby B. Archie

Danville Educator and Public Servant February 9, 1934 - June 26, 2010

Archie dedicated 37 years of service to the Danville Public School System's English department.

She ran for and was elected to Danville City Council in 1994. From 1996 to 1998, she served as vice mayor.

She was chosen in 1998 by council members as the city's first woman mayor.


On August 11, 2018, the Danville Public Library was dedicated to Mrs. Archie. It is the first municipal building in Danville to be named after a woman.



A QUICK THOUGHT FROM THE DESK OF THE DIRECTOR

April 12 is Drop Everything and Read, or D.E.A.R., day. This concept was brought to life by beloved children's author Beverly Cleary in *Ramona Quimby, Age 8*. This year, the American Library Association has decided one day is not enough for *D.E.A.R.* and declared the celebration too robust for just one day and are encouraging us all to spend the entire month making reading a priority activity. To celebrate, I suggest revisiting one of Cleary's works. My youngest son picked up a complimentary copy of *The Mouse and the Motorcycle* last year during our summer reading kickoff thanks to the staff of the Center for Early Success. He is a strong reader, but never actually wants to sit down and read so I was very excited when he asked if we could read together. I had not read this book in years but remembered enjoying the story when I was a kid; that memory paled in comparison to reading it with my son!

DON'T JUDGE A BOOK BY IT'S COVER



"We all have a sob story, but we don't all go around killing people."

Murder meets geriatrics in this witty, charming mystery about four friends living in a British retirement village, spending their days solving cold cases and drinking tea. These unlikely friends have all of the skills necessary

for solving crimes: Elizabeth's background as a spy, Ibrahim's psychiatrist's insights, Joyce's romanticism, and Ron's enthusiasm for undercover work.

If you like dry humor, cozy mysteries, and characters with an unapologetic enthusiasm for life, I recommend adding this title to your 'to read' list. And if you want to go a step further and discuss it, come to the library for the March 9 meeting of the Whodunit Book Club!

January and February were full of wintery fun in the Youth Services Department.











NEW YEAR, NEW START RESULTS

We kicked off the new year with a new amnesty program!

Thanks to your contributions we were able to donate over **30 bars of soap**, **30 toothbrushes**, **20 sticks of deodorant** and many more necessary items to Department of Social Services on behalf of youth in foster care.

With **135 items donated** we were able to **waive \$270 dollars worth of fines** from patron accounts this January.
