

Find the **Ruby B**. Archie Library site. Register for an account or sign in if you have participated in previous challenges!




BUZZIN' ON BOOKTOK



A classic I can reread over and over again, *Pride and Prejudice* will always be my go to "enemies to lovers" romance. Austen's flowery language transports me to her small town in the south of England where everyone seems to be untouched by the outside world that rages on. Austen first wrote *First Impressions* in 1796, which

was later published as *Pride and Prejudice*, in the midst of the French Revolution. I am always blown away by her own small, sometimes sarcastic, sometimes quite in-your-face, criticisms of her own blight placed carefully throughout the novel. This book is stimulating, clever, and romantic in every way that I absolutely adore. It is a classic for a reason! Her book is just as much about the power of choice, and what it means to form the opinions that influence those choices, as it is a charming romance.




STORYWALK TRAIL
