



Ron Rash, the North Carolina author of Serena (made into a movie starring Jennifer Lawrence and Bradley Cooper) is one of those. Rash's latest, *The Caretaker*, is set in Blowing Rock, NC, in 1951. Blackburn Grant is the caretaker for the local cemetery. Blackburn's only

friend, Jacob Lampton, marries Naomi despite strong disapproval from his parents. Jacob is then drafted into the Korean War and asks Blackburn to care for a pregnant Naomi during his absence. When Jacob his injured, his parents decide to deceive Blackburn, Jacob and Naomi in an attempt to have Jacob live the life they envision for him.

Written in Rash's poignant, descriptive prose, *The Caretaker* made me pause and reread sentences just to savor their meaning. The ending made me cheer!
