

In celebration of Women's History Month, which takes place in March, and National Poetry Month, which falls annually in April, the staff at Ruby B. Archie Public Library would like to highlight the works of local author Claudia Emerson (1957-2014).

According to poets.org, Emerson, a Chatham native, served as the poet laureate of Virginia from 2008 to 2010. She published six books of poetry including *The Opposite House* which can be found at the library. She received many awards and accolades over her lifetime including the Pulitzer Prize in poetry, which she was awarded in 2006 for her collection of poetry, *Late Wife*.

She was the poetry editor for the Greensboro Review and contributing editor for Shenandoah. She taught at Washington and Lee University, Randolph-Macon Women's College, and the University of Mary Washington.





Carol Ann Duffy, a master of poetic wit, invites the reader into the spirited inner world of these women as they opine on the consequences of their male counterparts' actions. Her commentary through verse is as entertaining as it is occasionally biting, a clever addition to many well known stories.
