


# **WELCOME TO MARINA CLEMENTS**



The Bullet Swallower by Elizabeth Gonzalez James is a rich tapestry of western adventure and family drama woven together with a thread of magical realism. The story is set primarily in two time periods, following Antonio Sonoro in 1895, a down on his luck bandido traveling to Texas to seek fortune and Jamie Sonoro in 1964, a renowned movie star in Mexico

grappling with the revelation of these buried family secrets. The writing style is vivid and evocative while still easy to follow and understand. The incorporation of real Mexican history and legends from the author's own family adds an important touch of authenticity. My own Mexican family has similar sensational stories. I believe we can all deeply relate to the conflicted feelings exploring our ancestors can bring.

Shuna's Journey, originally published in 1983, is written and illustrated by Hayao Miyazaki co-founder of Studio Ghibli. The same studio that brought us classic animation such as My Neighbor Tortoro and Castle in the Sky. Shuna's Journey is a 100-page stand alone graphic novel featuring an original storyline. Each panel is hand

drawn and hand painted by Hayao Miyazaki using a deep and rich color palette. I personally loved the raw art style used in this novel and how much care went into each panel. Every page is very colorful. As the story follows Shuna, we never know if the other characters he meets will be friends or enemies as they are all presented with a sense of mystery that keeps you guessing. Along the journey we get to see many varied landscapes and cityscapes. Miyazaki used many types of architecture from small huts to skyscrapers, from practical to fantastical construction. It really makes for a vibrant world full of possibilities!






