The Library is currently accepting entries for the 2024 Reflections of Home Art Exhibition which will be held from September 23-27.



### **SUMMER READING KICKOFF WAS WILD!**



James by Percival Everett is a retelling of Mark Twain's literary classic, The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn told from the point of view of Jim...or James as he prefers to be called. The timeline of this book parallels Twain's adventure neatly, but the narrative is a whole new story and an eye-opening glance into Jim's world.

Everett did a nice job in paying homage to the original work while expanding on the character arc of Jim and Huck. I consider myself lucky to have fallen in love with *Huck Finn* as a young reader, although I had a limited understanding of the world, and to have had the opportunity to rediscover the classic in a new light when I was ready to better understand the world through someone else's eyes.
