### WHY RECYCLE GLASS?

Glass recycling contributes to the overall health and well-being of communities. It conserves energy and natural resources while also reducing waste.

GLASS4GOOD<sup>™</sup> is a program developed by O-I to increase glass recycling in every community in which they operate. Through collaboration with the City of Danville, residents can safely and properly recycle their glass at four designated collection sites. After processing, the collected glass (cullet) from Danville's GLASS4GOOD<sup>™</sup> program is used at O-I's closest facility and is formed into new glass, sometimes in as little as 30 days. To further impact the community through glass recycling, O-I also provides a charitable donation to United Way of Danville-Pittsylvania County based on the weight of collected glass.

#### MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN DANVILLE

Danville's GLASS4GOOD<sup>™</sup> program currently benefits Danville Pittsylvania Cancer is an organization focused on improving the quality of life for local cancer patients by providing access to services needed to help in their battle against cancer.

Danville-Pittsylvania Cancer Association (formally Danville Cancer Association) was formed in 1959 and is a 501 (c)(3) charitable organization under IRS ruling. Originally the association began as a three part program that contributed towards local cancer research that was conducted by local physicians. The second part of the program included providing educational materials concerning cancer that was presented by representatives of the association to groups and the general public. The last part of the program was the patient services end, where aid in the form of travel reimbursement was provided for clients traveling out of town for treatments and through donated medical supplies and equipment.

- Beer/wine/champagne/ spirits/ non-alcoholic beverage glass bottles
- Food glass jars/containers

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE FOR RECYCLING:

- Windows
- Mirrors
- Light bulbs
- Solar panels
- Heat-resistant glass (e.g. Pyrex)
- Drinking glasses
- Computer/TV screens
