
Challenge Accepted and Completed!

Staff close out the 2024 reading challenge with long list of new favorite books.












THE HOPEFUL RETURN OF ARCHIE




I picked up Where Wolves Don't Die by Anton Treuer to read as a part of the November reading challenge, which is to read a book by an Indigenous author. It quickly rocketed to the top of my "Favorite Book I have Read This Year" list. The story features Ezra Cloud, an Ojibwe teenager who is constantly being targeted by a

local bully for his ancestry. When the bully's house burns to the ground, Ezra becomes a top suspect and is soon whisked away to stay on a reservation in Canada with his grandparents. There, Ezra learns to embrace his culture and his self while helping his grandfather run a trap line in the back woods.

I mostly listened to this audiobook, which is narrated by the author, on the Libby app. I would recommend giving that format a try to fully experience the heart behind the text of this beautifully written book.

In keeping with the December reading challenge, which is to read an award-winning book, I recently read the 1986 novel Forrest Gump by Winston Groom. This book was thrust into the bestseller spotlight after being adapted into an award-winning film in 1994. I expected it to be similar to the movie with a few differences, but boy was I wrong! The book

is quite a bit darker in tone than the film, which portrays the loveable titular character as innocent and endearing. In contrast, Groom's Forrest, while still being likeable, is gruff at times as he blunders his way through life, trying to maintain a sense of dignity. Another point of interest is that the book is written from Forrest's perspective and in his voice, so his spelling and grammatical errors are included. If you are a fan of the movie then give the book a try and see which version of Forrest most resonates with you!
