





THE BOOKS WE RECOMMEND

EMILE WILDERS FAERIES A NOVEL SY HEATTHER FAWGETT

Emily Wilde's Encyclopaedia of Faeries is an enchanting fantasy that follows Emily Wilde, a brilliant yet socially awkward scholar, as she studies the Folk in the remote Scandinavian town of Hrafnsvik. Alongside her infuriatingly charming colleague, Wendell Bambleby, Emily unravels the mysteries of the fae—while discovering that some legends are more dangerous than she ever

imagined. Emily's arc - both as a scholar and as a person - feels fully realized, and her relationship with Wendell is given the kind of resolution that makes for the perfect blend of romance, magic, and adventure. It's rare to find a series that so masterfully balances character growth, world-building, and plot momentum, but this one absolutely does. If you love fae folklore, academic rivals-to-lovers, or richly detailed fantasy worlds, this book (and its sequels) are a must-read.
