THE GLASS4GOOD™ PROGRAM



Glass recycling contributes to the overall health and well-being of communities. It conserves energy and natural resources while also reducing waste.

GLASS4GOOD[™] is a program developed by O-I to increase glass recycling in every community in which we operate. Through collaboration with the City of Danville, residents can safely and properly recycle their glass at four designated collection sites. After processing, the collected glass (cullet) from Danville's GLASS4GOOD[™] program is used at O-I's closest facility and is formed into new glass, sometimes in as little as 30 days. To further impact the community through glass recycling, O-I also provides a charitable donation to United Way of Danville-Pittsylvania County based on the weight of collected glass.

O-I ANNOUNCES UPDATED SUSTAINABILITY GOALS FOR 2030:



Fostering glass recycling ecosystems, including our GLASS4GOOD[™] programs, is essential to achieving our ambitious targets. By increasing the availability of cullet through community glass recycling initiatives, we can incorporate more cullet into our manufacturing process, further reducing our energy consumption and GHG emissions.

Did you know?

For every glass bottle you recycle, you save enough energy to:

- Power a 15-watt low energy lightbulb for 24 hours
- Charge 17 cell phones for an hour
- Power a computer for 25 minutes

Third Chance Housing: Recipient of 2025 GLASS4GOOD™ Donations

Chance Housing is a fairly new but effective non-profit in Danville making a difference working with at-risk families by supporting families in need of rent or utilities assistance. They advocate for these families, provide



empowerment classes for financial stability, and collaborate with others doing similar work. UWDPC receives over 500 calls a year. Of these, 40% need utilities assistance and 36% need rent assistance. GLASS4GOOD[™] donations to Third Chance Housing will allow the organization to assist more families facing crisis.

- Mirrors
- Light bulbs
- Solar panels
- Heat-resistant glass (e.g. Pyrex)
- Drinking glasses
- Computer/TV screens
